Speaking up at the Canadian Wheat Board elections . . .

Make your voice heard during the upcoming Canadian Wheat Board (CWB) elections. The CWB election period began September 7, 2004 for districts 2, 4, 6, 8 and 10. Mail-in ballots must be post-marked no later than December 3, 2004.

The Western Canadian Wheat Growers Association (WCWGA) encourages all eligible voters to support candidates who believe the option to choose the single desk approach for commodities through pooling of market shares *should be a producer preference*.

Who's eligible to vote?

To be eligible to vote, you must be on the voting list. While CWB permit book holders are automatically on the voters list, you **DO NOT NEED A PERMIT BOOK TO VOTE**. Any producer from an even-numbered district, who grows wheat, barley, rye, flaxseed or canola may vote, regardless of how you use or market your crop.

If you don't have a permit book, but would like to vote, you can still get on the voters list. To do so, you'll need to fill out a statutory declaration form, available from Meyers Norris Penny online at www.cwbelection.com or by calling their toll free number at 1-800-446-0890. The declaration needs to be signed by a Commissioner for Oaths or a Notary Public, available through banks, law offices, police stations and some grain buyers. The completed form must then be submitted to Meyers Norris Penny before November 19, 2004, 5:00 p.m.
